"@Sophie Takes a #Selfie" is about self-love, self-respect and self-worth. Sophie learns the proper etiquette for sharing, reposting or tagging photos or artwork without permission, along with the age old, still relevant "if you can't say something nice..." and stresses that it is not ever, under any circumstance, necessary to tell someone he or she is ugly. "You should just go kill yourself." The sad fact is that some kids do.
