what cultural influences may be present in the passage including the original language, references to historical figures, references to cultural practices or customs, etc. Consultation: Look up multiple commentaries on the passage you're studying to discover what you may have missed, help to illuminate difficult passages, and determine whether your own interpretation is on the right path.
