Following the basic concept, communication is the process of sending and receiving messages or transferring information from one part to another. This model is Shannon and Weaver Model of Communication Communication models have evolved from the first rudimentary model by Shannon and Weaver in 1949, which described transmission. This linear model was fairly mechanistic, and basically reflected the idea that the sender and receiver had little to do with the interpretation of the message, which was essentially independent.
